1. Introduction §16b AufenthG

- §16b AufenthG allows students from non-EU countries to stay and study in Germany
- defines students' rights and obligations
- important for legal and successful study in Germany



Rights and obligations §16b AufenthG

Rights

- entitles to stay in Germany for the purpose of studying
- right to work limited to 140 full days or 280 half-days annually and other student activities
- **max. 10 years** (including Studienkolleg, Bachelor and Master)
- Additional 5 years if you continue with PhD

Obligations


- register your address (Anmeldung)
- maintain health insurance coverage
- proof of financial resources
- apply for and hold a valid residence permit (§16b) regularly
- inform authorities if study or personal circumstances change

2. Registration of address

Mandatory for everyone living in Germany for more than 3 months

You need the **Meldebescheinigung (Proof of Residence)** in order to


- open a bank account,
- get German health insurance,
- apply for a residence permit,
- get a mobile phone number.





Registration of address

What if you haven't found permanent accommodation?

- If you sublet a flat / room: main tenant needs to get permission and issues „Wohnungsgeberbestätigung“
- Mandatory if you sublet for more than 3 months, voluntary if less than 3 months
- If you live temporarily with relatives / friends without paying rent: main tenants need to have permission to sublet and issue „Wohnungsgeberbestätigung“





The Office for Migration is authorized to attach an apostille or pre-certification to public documents issued by authorities in the Free and Hanseatic City of Hamburg. Documents from other countries are not covered by this process. For criminal record certificates (Führungszeugnisse), you can obtain the apostille or pre-certification from the relevant authorities in the respective country.

Construction advice and inspection of building files in the district of Eimsbüttel

The WBZ is responsible for information regarding building law matters and the potential development of properties. The building records are available for request access to their property files.







Residence Permit Hamburg

Do you need a residence permit for yourself or your child? This online service can help. You can enter your personal details online, upload your documents and submit everything to the correct agency. The agency can then start processing your application. Information on this online service and the processing of your residence permit can be found below.




Residence permit - Which documents do you need?

- national passport
- proof of residence (Meldebestätigung)
- rental agreement or other proof of accommodation
- current certificate of study/ enrollment
- proof of financial resources (following slide)
- health insurance confirmation

For appointment:

- biometric photograph (not older than six months)
- fee: appr. 100 EUR

Residence permit – finances

Minimum of 992 EUR/month or 11.904 EUR/year

Proof of finance:

- bank account statement
- scholarship
- formal obligation (Verpflichtungserklärung)
- bank statements of parents...
- own income (usually only after you have received residence permit)
- combination 1-5



Residence permit – what`s next?

- It can take up to 5 months before you hear back from the Hamburg Welcome Center.
- You should receive a fictional certificate before your visa expires.


In case of visa-free entry:

- Please mention during the online application that you were granted visa-free entry and need an appointment, urgently.

For general questions, please contact the Hamburg Welcome Center directly.

When your visa expires

- If you have submitted your application for a residence permit prior to the expiry of your entry visa, **your visa will remain valid** until a decision on the application has been made. (§81, section 4 AufenthG)
- You should receive a document called [Fiktionsbescheinigung](#) (fictional certificate).
- **PLEASE NOTE:** Differences between visa-free entry and entry with visa.




When your visa expires

	Visa necessary to enter Germany	Visa-free entry into Germany
Application for a visa to enter Germany	X	not necessary
Application for a residence permit after entering Germany	X	X
Travel within the Schengen Area / Traveling out of and reentering Germany	possible during the entire length of visa	only within the 90-day visa-free entry period (not when no residence permit has been issued after the 90 days have expired)
Employment in Germany while studying	X	not possible until residence permit has been issued

If your visa expires


- ... and you haven't received a fictional certificate: Please contact the Hamburg Welcome Center
- ...and you were granted visa-free entry: ...please contact the Hamburg Welcome Center and explain entered without a visa but need an appointment for a residence permit, soon.



Residence permit – Am I allowed to work?

Employment up to 140 full days or 280 half-days per year
and secondary student work

- half-day = max. 4 hours,
- calendar year is relevant
- every legal job (no self-employment)




Residence permit – Am I allowed to work?

Secondary student activities (without any time restriction)

- student activities at universities and other academic institutions
- activities which serve an educational purpose in the subject area of the studies (e.g. AStA),
- **no time limit**

EU-Citizens

- no restrictions



Residence permit – Am I allowed to work?


PLEASE NOTE:

- students are generally only allowed to work a maximum of 20 hours / week during the semester (secondary student activities included)

Residence permit – Am I allowed to study abroad?

Yes!


- If you plan to stay out of Germany for more than six months, please let your local immigration authority know.
- You will have to make sure your residence permit is valid until after your return to Germany.
- If you intend to spend a semester abroad within the EU, please contact us. We will discuss with you possible entry visa, REST directive etc.



Residence permit – Am I allowed to change my subject?


Yes!

- You need to inform your local immigration authority.
- Change of subject usually no problem during the first three to four semesters.
- After this time, the immigration authorities evaluate each case individually (statement by university might be requested; can the new program be finished within 10 years?)




Residence permit – typical pitfalls

- Renew your residence permit before it expires
- Proof of financial resources necessary (can be mix of savings and job or scholarship => 992 € / month)
- Inform your Immigration Authority (Ausländerbehörde) of any changes in your student status (change of study program, graduation)
- You are allowed to work 140 full days or 280 half days per year => if you would like to work self-employed = „selbstständig“, you need the permission by the immigration authority.



Residence permit – typical pitfalls

- You are allowed to leave Germany for six months
=> if you do not return in time, your residence permit will expire
- If you would like to take part in a study-abroad program, inform your immigration authority about your plans
- **Limitation of ten years for Bachelor`s and Master`s degree**
- After graduation, you can apply for a job-seeking permit (for up to 18 months), work permit or Blue Card EU
